

## &lt;Numbering code&gt;

The numbering code indicated on the left side of each subject shows its general information, as below.

- ① Dept. code: the code showing which department offers the course/subject in question.
- ② Category code: the code showing what category the course/subject falls into.
- ③ Level code: the number showing the difficulty level of the course/subject. (Level 1-5)
- ④ Serial number: the number identifying the subject from those which have the same dept. code, category code and level code.

<b>1</b>	Introductory subject <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Basic general education subjects and basics of special subjects specific to a department</li> </ul> (Special subjects specific to a department at entrance level)
<b>2</b>	Intermediate subject <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•General education subjects and special subjects specific to a department at intermediate level</li> </ul>
<b>3</b>	Subjects addressing advanced topics <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•General education subjects and special subjects specific to a department at advanced practical level</li> </ul>
<b>4</b>	Subjects appropriate for fourth-year students <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•The highest level subjects for undergraduate.</li> <li>•It includes seminar for graduation thesis, seminar for graduating students, graduation thesis, graduation research etc.</li> </ul>
<b>5</b>	Subject of graduate school level <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•General education subjects for graduate school level.</li> <li>•Practical and special subjects for graduate school level.</li> </ul>
