

<Numbering code>

The numbering code indicated on the left side of each subject shows its general information, as below.

- ① Dept. code: the code showing which department offers the course/subject in question.
- ② Category code: the code showing what category the course/subject falls into.
- ③ Level code: the number showing the difficulty level of the course/subject. (Level 1-5)
- ④ Serial number: the number identifying the subject from those which have the same dept. code, category code and level code.

| 5 | <Subject of graduate school level> •General education subjects for graduate school level. •Practical and special subjects for graduate school level. |
