- Without the action research program, I would not have improved the way I teach and would have missed chances to learn more effective ways to teach English and other related matters.
- This year, I tried out several in-class ER activities and observed how students developed their reading habits. I attended the monthly workshops and I had to reflect the activities and monitor students reading, which was a great help. If I hadn't worked on the project, I wouldn't have reflected classes.
